FELLOWSHIPS AT ENS

The Remarque Institute supports up to two faculty members and two doctoral students each year who wish to spend up to one semester in research residency at the École Normale Supérieure in Paris. Candidacy is normally limited to NYU faculty and students, and Columbia University doctoral students affiliated with the Consortium for Intellectual and Cultural History. In exceptional cases, applicants from Remarque affiliates will also be considered.

These Fellowships are non-stipendiary and are intended for faculty and doctoral students on sabbatical leave, extramural funding, other outside support, fellowship support, or extramural funding. Faculty fellows are provided with modest shared office space at ENS, round-trip travel between New York and Paris, and a modest per diem subsidy for the duration of their stay. Graduate students fellows are provided with cost-free, modest student housing within Paris, shared office space at ENS, and round-trip travel between New York and Paris.

A one-month Invited Professorship (Professeur Invité) position at ENS each year is also available. The professorship is awarded by the Remarque Institute, in consultation with ENS. Invited Professors are expected to spend at least four weeks in Paris, and to give four different public presentations (in French) during the course of their stay. Invited Professors (Professeurs Invités) are remunerated at the rate of 1/12th annual salary on the French national professorial scale, and their round-trip travel between New York and Paris is also provided.

If you wish to apply for a Fellowship, please complete the application form and return it, together with a curriculum vitae, a description of your current interests and the work you would propose to undertake while in residence at ENS (2 pages maximum), and the names of two references to the address below by **January 15, 2020**.

A complete application consists of the following:

- A completed application form
- A complete and up-to-date curriculum vitae
- A description of the current research
- Names of two references.

Applications must be postmarked or emailed to Remarque.Institute@nyu.edu no later than **January 15, 2020**. Fellowship awards will be announced by **March 15, 2020**.
